The Baptism of our Lord 13 January 2019

In December, Parish Council sadly accepted the resignation of Wendy Ashley-Cooper as our Office Administrator. We have been very appreciative of the ministry Wendy has offered on a Friday since January last year. It has meant that we have been able to offer a full time Parish Office.

Parish Council discussed at length the importance of keeping the office open five days per week but also the need for us to curb some of our expenditure to make ends meet and so have decided to trial having volunteers in the office on a Friday morning. If you are willing to assist with the phone on a Friday morning as well as some simple administrative tasks, please speak with me as soon as possible. If we find that there is too much work for a Friday morning or we feel that the office is not manageable in this way, the Church Wardens and I will advertise for a paid person to work on Fridays. Unfortunately the position will be quite fluid for a few weeks as we readjust Heather's responsibilities to evaluate the tasks that can be completed from Monday to Thursday. Some flexibility therefore will be needed.

We are also looking for a few more volunteers who may be able to take on some of the office tasks through the week. Some tasks, such as typing up the hymns for the power point at St Andrew's could be completed from home once or twice a month and then emailed through; or proof reading the pewsheets can be done online or in print format each week. Other tasks such as managing the photocopier through its pew sheet printing cycle need to be completed in the Office.

While we once again go through this process of change in the Parish Office, I thank you for your understanding and patience. And I wish to thank Heather Van Den Bos for the ministry she offers and her patience and diligence with caring for the administration side of the Parish.

Finally, can I say thank you to Wendy for her conscientious ministry over the past year. So many small tasks have been very capably managed by Wendy and we will miss her friendly face in the Parish Office on Fridays.

THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

Today is the Feast of the Baptism of the Our Lord. It comes on the Sunday after the Epiphany which is also called 'the Manifestation of Christ'. In the Western Church the Manifestation of Christ has always exclusively focused on the visit of the Wise Men to Bethlehem. In the Eastern Church however, the Manifestation of Christ, the revealing of his true nature, has been focused on the Declaration made at his baptism in the Jordan: 'You are my Son, the Beloved'. These days therefore the Western Church keeps first Epiphany on January 6 as the manifestation of Christ to the wise men; then on the following Sunday the Baptism of Jesus and the manifestation of the true nature of Christ to others at his baptism.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Eternal God,
at the baptism of Jesus in the river Jordan
you proclaimed him your beloved Son,
and anointed him with the Holy Spirit:
grant that all who are baptised into his name
may keep the covenant they have made,
and boldly confess him as Lord and Saviour;
who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns,
one God, in glory everlasting. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Isaiah 43:1-7

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, 'Give them up,' and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth – everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

Hear the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Commentary: Having been defeated in battle in 587BC the Jews have been taken away to exile to Babylon. Here a prophet arises with a message of hope. God has not forsaken them he says. You are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you. He foresees a time when everyone who is called by my name' will be gathered together under God's rule.

PSALM 29

Response: **The Lord strengthens his people**

1. Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven:
ascribe to the Lord glory and might.

O worship the Lord in the beauty of his holiness.

SECOND READING

Acts 8.14-17

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Hear the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Commentary: An evangelist called Philip had gone to Samaria and had some success in preaching Christ and converting Samaritans to follow Christ. They are baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus, an unusual manner and perhaps recalling a very early form of baptism because baptism from early on was always in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and not just Christ Jesus. It seems that it was also accompanied with the laying on of hands, and this makes sense of the Apostles Peter and John going to Samaria to complete the rite through the laying on of hands. Luke wants to show that it is the Apostles, not itinerant evangelists, who are the authorised agents of Christ in advancing the Gospel and through whom the Holy Spirit is given.

GOSPEL

Luke 3.15-22

Alleluia! Alleluia!

The heavens were opened, and the Father's voice was heard:

This is my beloved Son, hear him.

Alleluia!

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, chapter 3, beginning at the 15th verse.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

In the wilderness John proclaimed a baptism of repentance. As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people. But Herod the ruler, who had been rebuked by him because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the evil things that Herod had done, added to them all by shutting up John in prison.

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

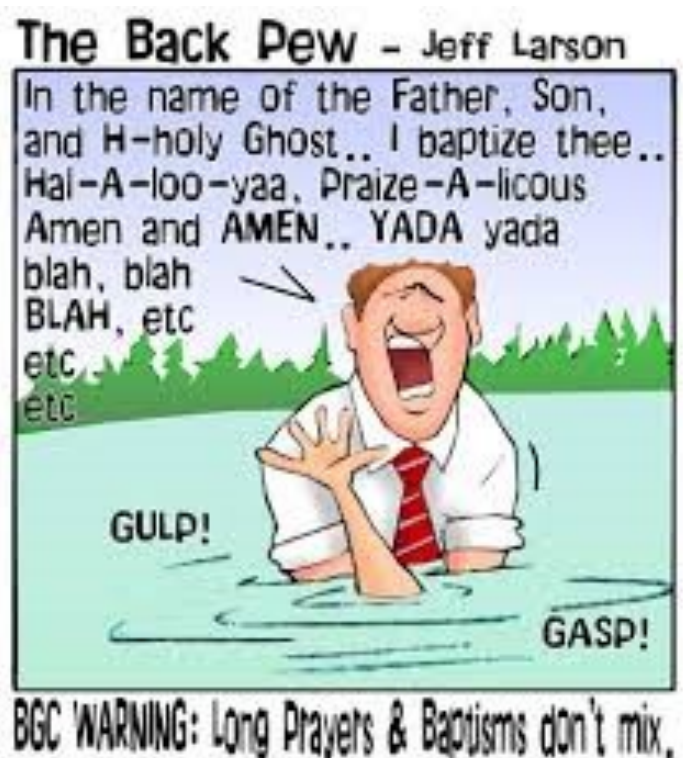
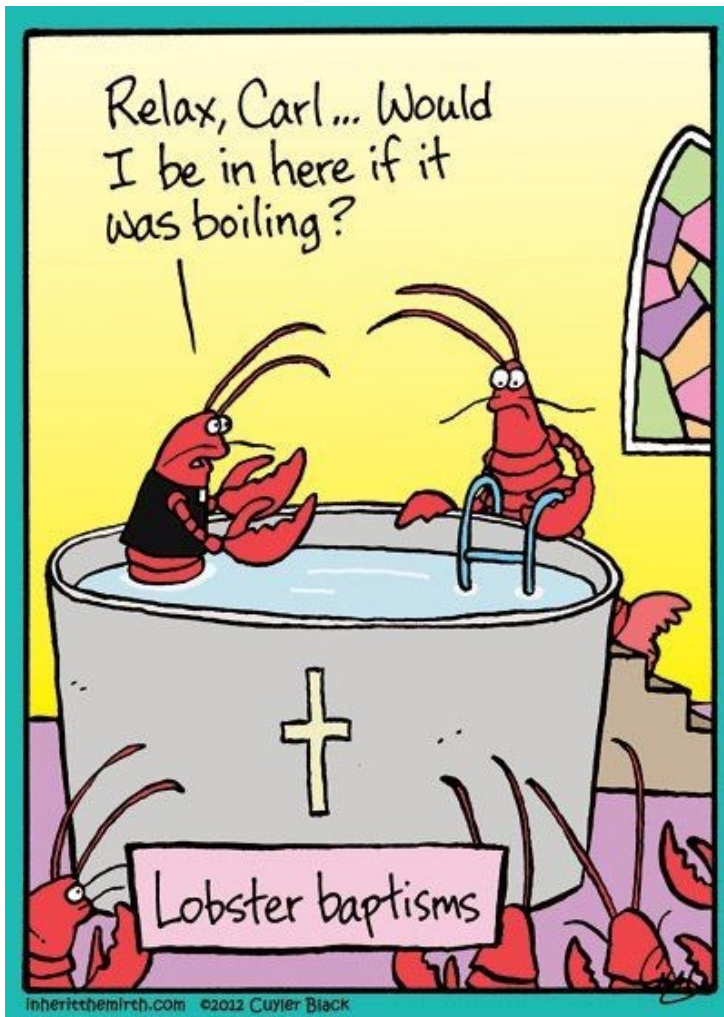
Praise to you, Lord Jesus **Christ.**

Commentary: This is Luke's account of the baptism of Jesus. He sets the baptism in the context of prayer – a favourite device of Luke's. The vision which accompanies the baptism serves to bring Jesus out of obscurity and indicates that from now on he is the protagonist in the story that follows.

Sentence

The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus in bodily form like a dove, and a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased. Luke 3: 22

We are preparing a copy of the **Annual Report Book** with reports from the Rector, Church Wardens, Treasurer, and all ministry groups. Nomination forms for all positions are available at the back of each church. You are reminded that these are nominations and elections may be required. It is therefore possible that you will not be elected, however everyone is encouraged to show their interest and nominate. If you are interested in finding out more about the role, please speak to a member of Parish Council. While it is possible to fill positions from the floor of the meeting, it is desirable for people to have considered the role carefully and prayerfully before nomination.

*Following Diocesan regulations governing Parish Annual Meetings, questions, petitions and motions to be raised at the Meeting need to be given to the Rector in writing a week in advance, by **Sunday, 17 February, 2019.***

We are aware of some people who are not yet on our **Parish Roll**. Unfortunately, if you are not on the roll, you will not be able to vote at the annual meeting. We want everyone to feel they belong and can have a say. There are some copies of the form to join the roll at each Church - please take one and return it to the Sidespersons as soon as possible.
