REFLECTION 9

When a car crashes we sometimes find that the insurance doesn't cover the cost of repair and the car becomes a write-off. We might have bought it second hand and we might have had it a few years and the value had fallen faster than the cost of repair.

But let us pursue the story a little bit. Suppose that car was a vintage model. Its value may not be economic: maybe its age, or style, or nostalgic value far surpasses its economic value. Would we add to our insurance money and fix it up?

What qualities affect the value of our wrecked car?

And where should we keep our car?

Perhaps we might keep it in a garage, or on-street parking. Perhaps we park it in a car park and drive it around the streets, or maybe, if it is a vintage car we keep it for special days: a trip down the coast on a Sunday afternoon: maybe to a rally and park it among other vintage cars, just to show it off! Perhaps we repair, polish and present it.

Now there's no right or wrong about this.

It's just that sometimes the value of something lies beyond money: sometimes it doesn't.

A walkabout through my dreaming thoughts: Dream I

I've noticed that there are quite a lot of festivals and markets around the community. Should we buy a tent and present tableaux and scenes from our nativity plays and passion stories with songs if we

create a Music And Drama group? We could take the tent around the festivals to advertise the parish and all our activities. The tent could become a mobile stage for the tableaux and music as well as a place to give out hot coffee or tea, or cold peach, or apple tea. There is a regular market along Bulcock Street on a Sunday Mornings. Should we arrange a procession through the street to St. Andrew's in time for the Sunday Morning service?
