REFLECTION 10

Which church do we want to create?

Do we want to write it off as an expensive waste of money?

Do we want to rebuild it and treasure every brick and stick and enshrine it.

Do we want to move it, lock-stock and barrel to a more advantageous place where there is more passing trade?

Do we want to create an oasis: become the main attraction within the clamour of society and become a focal hub of community in a relative suburban desert?

Options.

We could sell up the plot and move the church and congregation to

- A. Somewhere more busy with passing trade.
- B. We could sell up the whole plot and move to a more remote and cheaper plot of land and try to become the reason people come to it.
- C. We could keep the church as it is, repair it and enshrine what it has meant to us in the past.
- D. We could develop the site with the present church as the focal point.
- E. We could develop the site, building up above the car park, sell off the church plot.
- F. We could sell up the whole lot and go rent a community hall, or shop front.

As I've been exploring the community, I have visited various cafés.

I tend to write my sermons in such places!

And you can find cafés in very different places.

You can find a Coffee Club café in most shopping malls. There is a huge footfall, but no one lingers very long.

Then there are cafés along a Main Street, or along a beach promenade. They might be busy, if the street, or beach is popular.

And then there's a cafe in a relative oasis: The hub, near Oval Avenue and Arthur Street set well back from the main roads and businesses and any passing trade.

To visit it you have to make a decisive decision to go and visit it, but its popularity depends entirely upon its own character and attractiveness. It doesn't rely upon passing trade. It itself is the attraction, and people, having taken the time to get to it linger and enjoy the experience, the ambience and atmosphere.

We need to be that attraction. As I said earlier, Jesus said, they will know us by the love we have for one another.

Prayer, the singing of distinctive and much-repeated prayer chants and silence are at the heart of the Taize experience.</p>
<p>CONGREGATION CONFERENCE: We plan to have a Congregation conference 13 November immediately following worship. We propose that the Sunday worship be a joint service of all congregations at St. Andrew's for 9am. (This will mean there will be no worship provided at the other worship centres on that day).
