<p>SUMMARY POINTS FROM OCTOBER PARISH COUNCIL:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parish Councillors are in favour of re-introducing both Bread and Wine at Eucharist services in the Parish. This will be an individual's choice as to whether he/she wishes to receive both bread and wine or bread only. Health implications have been considered. • Parish Council continues to investigate providing a defibrillator at St. Thomas' with a possible community fundraiser as one suggestion. • Approval was given for the Parish to pay for the installation of a donated air conditioner in St. Thomas' Church. • Approval was given to replace the 2 analogue mounted wall speakers at St. Andrew's Church, with 4 digital speakers to improve clarity. • The Project Task Group, formed to discuss and facilitate work needed to address sub-structure issues at St. Andrew's Church, met on Friday November 4, after a recent report was given by EBIS engineers. • There is an opportunity for <u>parishioner input</u> at a <u>congregational meeting</u> to be held after the <u>combined 9am Eucharist service at St. Andrew's</u> on November 13.
