Dear Friends

I can't say how accurate this is, but it comes from a reasonably authentic source, but in the preparation for the coronation of King Charles III the liturgy to be used was released as resources for those churches that might have a service to coincide. I was listening during the TV coverage and I couldn't quite make out or quite decide whether this was used, or corrected, but the collect was released in preparatory papers. I ponder whether you can spot the mistake.(*answer below!)

Just imagine how many administrative, secretarial, office, clerical, church and royal palace staff had a chance to check and agree to it.

Archbishop of Canterbury:

Let us pray.

Lord, enthroned in heavenly splendour: look with favour upon thy servant Charles our King, and bestow upon him such gifts of wisdom and love that we and all thy people may live in peace and prosperity and in loving service one to another,

to thine eternal glory; who with the Father and the Holy Spirit reigns supreme over all things, one God, now and for ever.

*Someone, somewhere missed out the phrase "through Jesus Christ our Lord," and in so doing elevated King Charles III to divine status equating him with a place in the divine trinity! How embarrassing!

It all goes to prove that mistakes can be made, no matter how many people there are to check something. A priest can make a mistake: parish staff, church wardens, members of parish councils, LAs, members of choir, readers, audio-visual producers, cleaners, flower arrangers, gardeners, members of a congregation, magazine and pew bulletin editors, website and electronic communicators, everyone, in fact, can make mistakes.

It used to tickle my brain thinking about education. Some of us do well at school, some of us do well at further and higher education. But very few of us achieve 100% at any of those levels. Which means that nearly all of us do less than perfect. We all make mistakes.

Jesus, being the Son of God, and our saviour understand this. He doesn't ask us to be perfect. He asks us to try. In fact that is why he willingly suffered being crucified: to save us from our mistakes. Heaven isn't full of perfect people. Heaven isn't perfect because we are perfect. Heaven is perfect because God perfectly bestows God's grace upon us and perfectly forgives us.

SO THAT WE REMEMBER – from Rev Dr Ray

The entry for 12 May on the Website "<u>So That We Remember</u>" contains quotes from a letter written in 1826 to the *Methodist Missionary Society* in London by a colonist in Australia. Part of it reads: *Justice demands what humanity dictates, and Christianity requires, that we should not usurp the possession of another's rights, however advantageous such may be to ourselves or however easy of accomplishment.*

It is almost 200 years since that was written. Is that still a minority view in modern Australia?

GARDEN NOTES – from Ken and the gardeners

Originating from South America and introduced as a garden ornamental, the tree, which can grow 10m high, has escaped gardens and invaded our coastal areas. Its berries are spread by birds and animals and the plant contains toxic resins that can affect human and animal health.

There were several large Pepper trees in St Andrew's Garden and despite cutting off at ground level, they continued to grow shoots and had left a legacy of seedlings in our garden due to being spread by birds. An indication of just how invasive this species has become; the Council are using drone technology to locate and eradicate along coastal shoreline.



Some alternatives to Broad Leaf Pepper are: Blueberry Ash, Tuckeroo, Beach Bird's Eye and Cooloola Ironwood.
